Troop #132 Conduct Guidelines

The following rules were drafted by the Leadership of Troop 132. They apply to every meeting, outing, camping trip, fundraiser or other scout activity:

Expected Scout Behavior

- Abide by the Scout Law and the Scout Oath.
- Participate in scout activities in cooperation with other troop members and leaders. In consideration of other troop members, be punctual and agree to follow the bedtime, sleep and activity schedule of the troop.
- Set a good example by keeping neatly dressed and presentable. Come to meetings in uniform as specified by the Scoutmaster. Attend outings in clothing appropriate for the weather and activity.
- Be responsible for keeping tent and personal gear labeled, clean and neat. Neither the troop nor Council will be responsible for loss or breakage of personal items. No borrowing without permission.
- No leaving a meeting/outing without permission of a leader. During an outing, stay with the group.

Fire Safety: Only Scouts who have earned and are in possession of a Firem'n Chit may build, light or tend a fire.

Knife, Ax, and Saw Safety: Only Scouts who have earned and are in possession of a Totin' Chip may use these tools.

Restricted Items: All stove fuel will be distributed by the Scout Master when necessary for cooking and collected afterward. Liquid fuel is allowable only for safe use with cooking stoves.

Prohibited Items: **Do not bring to any scout meeting or function!**

Lighters, fireworks, caps, incense. Fixed/lock blade knives over 3". Aerosol can products. Controlled substances. Electronic entertainment devices: Gameboy, Walkman, CD player, IPOD, etc. Unscout-like literature. Firearms, ammunitions, or bow and arrow. Ax/saw (will be supplied by troop).

Scout misconduct or infraction of the above rules may result in any or all of the following:

- A 'friendly reminder' from a Scout's peers or supervising adults.
- Scoutmaster, Assistant Scoutmaster, or other designated adult reviews the Conduct Rules with the Scout and makes sure the Scout understands the nature of the offense.
- Parents of the Scout and the Troop Committee are notified of the misconduct.
- Parents of the Scout are asked to accompany him on future scout outings.
- The Scout and his parents meet with the Troop Committee to discuss the future of the Scout with Troop #132. Repeated violations will result in the Scout being placed on 'inactive' status.

Each Scout and his parents are required to review the above rules, and sign below acknowledging their understanding of Troop 132 Conduct Guidelines, and agreeing to abide by this safety measure necessary for the safety of all Troop members.
